# ARKANSAS

IN 2011, 210 FOUNDATIONS IN ARKANSAS GRANTED \$772,315,494. IN COMPARISON TO 2009, THERE WAS AN 18.6% INCREASE IN THE DOLLARS GIVEN AND A 13.0% DECLINE IN THE ASSETS OF FOUNDATIONS ACROSS THE STATE. THE AVERAGE GRANT SIZE IN 2011 WAS \$141,349.3


Table AR 1.2: Total amount of foundation assets in Arkansas


