

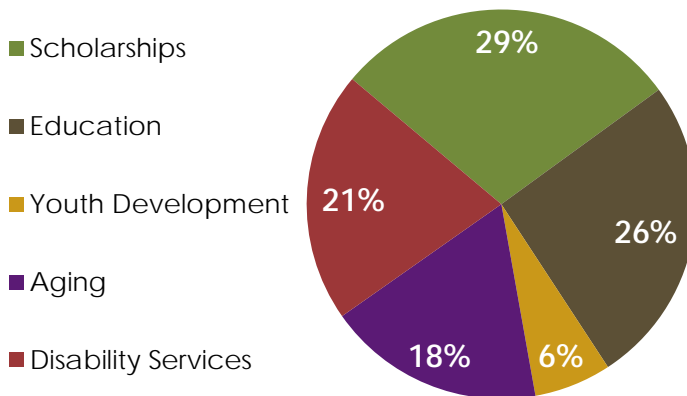

REPRESENTATIVE GRANTS

Education

- E3 Alliance: \$20,000 of continued support through the Expansion Plan for RAISE^{UP} Texas, a whole-school approach to improve student achievement in middle schools based on the University of Kansas Strategic Instruction Model. The Mitte Foundation funded the 2011–2015 Demonstration Project with \$200,000, which showed compelling results, closing performance gaps with struggling students.

Youth Development

- C5 Youth Foundation of Texas: \$10,000 to support the youth leadership program for at-risk, low-income youth, providing active leadership opportunities and college/career preparation over a five-year period (8th–12th grades).

Aging

- AGE of Central Texas: \$10,000 continued annual support for the Caregiver Resource Program, providing in-depth, one-on-one consultations, addressing individual needs to connect caregivers to resource providers for the elderly.

Disability Services

- Goodwill Industries of Central Texas: \$10,000 to support the Deaf Services program, providing job readiness training, job placement, supported employment, case management, and job retention support to deaf/hard of hearing individuals and their employers.

THE FOUNDATION

History: The Roy F. & Joann Cole Mitte Foundation was formed in 1994 by Roy and Joann Mitte. Success in the insurance and real estate industries enabled the native Texans the good fortune to dedicate a part of their wealth to philanthropic service in perpetuity. The Mittes believed that hard work, persistence, loyalty, and dedication should be rewarded.

Vision: Scholars of the highest merit are joined with community organizations of highest effectiveness to perpetuate the Mitte family's belief in the American ideals of prosperity and individual freedom.

Mission: To identify, engage, and support educational and community organizations that have the potential to manifest the Foundation's vision.

Geographic Scope: The Foundation's geographic scope of giving includes two regions of Texas of special interest to our founder's: Central Texas Hill Country and Brownsville.

Grant Focus: We fund 501(c)(3) organizations and public entities in areas of Education, Youth Development, Aging, and Disability Services.

Scholarships: We offer academic scholarships to high school graduates planning to attend a two- or four-year college or university in the state of Texas within one year of high school graduation. Renewal scholarships are available to those receiving initial awards for up to three additional academic years of funding.

Carriage House: We partner with Mission Capital, a 501(c)(3) organization providing support to public charities in the Austin area, to offer free meeting space at the Mitte Foundation Carriage House to 501(c)(3) member organizations.
