OVERVIEW OF PHILANTHROPY IN THE SOUTHWEST

This report is a snapshot of one year of foundation giving in the southwestern United States, providing a comprehensive look at foundations and giving in the region.

Based on the most current data available (2014 foundation tax returns), the study analyzes over 138,000 grants and identifies more than 97% of total giving in the seven-state membership region for Philanthropy Southwest – Arkansas, Arizona, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas.¹

By going beyond the largest foundations to also capture detailed data on small, regional and family foundations, the study illuminates the commitments, activities, and investments foundations make. This presents a clear picture of how foundations are providing financial resources, as well as partnering with nonprofit organizations and offering thought leadership aimed at strengthening communities and expanding opportunities for individuals, families, and organizations across the southwest.

With comparisons provided to findings from the 2014 study, the 2016 Giving Study highlights the dynamic nature of philanthropy in the region.² For the first time, this study included health conversion foundations, in addition to private and community foundations.

Overall, the foundations contributed more than \$6.3 billion to charitable causes, a 22.5% increase, while their assets totaled over \$92.5 billion, an increase of 28%. The 14 health care conversion foundations in the region held assets of \$4.5 billion and giving of \$215.7 million. The 90 community foundations had assets of \$10.9 billion and giving of nearly \$962 million.

Community foundations saw significant growth with their overall giving in the southwest region increasing by 73%. Led by foundations in Oklahoma, Texas, and Colorado, 9 community foundations

each received \$100 million or more in gifts between 2012 and 2014. As well, the assets of community foundations in Nevada increased by 105% during this time period.

The study also found that 604 new foundations were created and began making grants during this time period, suggesting a continuing post-recession economic recovery that encouraged increased philanthropic activity. While these new foundations accounted for 3% of assets and 3.9% of giving, the fact that they comprise nearly 10% of the total number of foundations points to the possibility of even greater giving in the coming years.

While equally-detailed national data that compare to Philanthropy Southwest's 2016 Giving Study are not available, 2014 data from the Foundation Center show foundation assets nationally to be \$821.1 billion, with \$52.9 billion in total giving nationally. A comparison between these two reports suggests the southwest region holds about 11% of all foundation assets and is contributing about 12% of philanthropic dollars nationally.


This Giving Study provides a detailed map that can be used to inform, encourage and support like-minded philanthropies in connecting, learning from one another, and endeavoring to significantly advance efforts that address societal needs. Members of Philanthropy Southwest, which hold 29% of the overall assets in the region, are afforded the additional benefit of being able to delve more deeply into the data and create customized reports that focus on specific areas of interest.

We applaud Philanthropy Southwest members for their continuing commitment to advocate for and mobilize effective philanthropy through the exchange of ideas, experiences, expertise, and data, including the Giving Study.

- ¹ Researcher Jankowski Associates, Inc. identified 6,372 independent grantmaking, health conversion and community foundations in Philanthropy Southwest's seven states that reported assets of at least \$1 million or total contributions of at least \$10,000 between 2012 and 2014. Grants of \$1,000 and up were captured. Data analyzed for this study only include investments made by foundations that are headquartered or located in the region.
- ² To provide the most accurate comparison possible, the comparative 2011 data in the 2016 Giving Study is updated from what was reported in the 2014 Giving Study to reflect a broader data set (e.g., reporting assets of \$1 million vs. \$5 million in previous reports, and the addition of health care conversion foundations).





Table A.2: Number of foundation grants in the region and states



B | MEMBER STATES OVERVIEW

Philanthropy Southwest members account for 29% of assets and 21% of total giving in the region. The average grant by Philanthropy Southwest Members is higher than the average grant across all foundations within the seven-state region (\$44,499 is the average of all foundations in the region; \$58,237 is the average Philanthropy Southwest member foundation grant).



C | ASSETS AND GIVING RANGES

Philanthropy is active across all levels of asset and giving capacity. One-third of all foundations in the Philanthropy Southwest Region have assets between \$1 million and \$4.9 million. 70% of foundations in the southwest have annual giving of less than \$250,000.










